# Get more from maize. Undersow maize with grass.

# What are the benefits from undersowing maize with grass?

**Soil is more resilient to damage** at harvest.

**Reduces over winter erosion** by improving stability and **reduces risk** of field run off.

Acts as a catch crop and locks in nutrients for

spring crops. Keeps soil microbes active and working for you.

Potential to utilise grass for over winter grazing or for an early cut.

Easier to travel when spreading manures early in season.



IPM3: Companion Crops. £55/ha/year. Straight grass mixture.

SAM2: Multispecies winter cover. Grass plus clover/other species. £129/ha. This will need to be left until the end of Feb or 6 weeks before Spring crop is sown.

IPM4: No insecticide: £45/ha per year. Available where NO Force dressing is used.

### What are the key considerations when undersowing maize?



How and when do you sow the grass?

Which grasses should you sow—and at what rates? How do you control weeds in your maize crop? How to make sure that the grass doesn't compete with your maize and that you can still grow a high yielding, high quality crop of maize?
